These Founding Donors help to carry on George's legacy as we continue to promote that which was most dear to him; the betterment of our Brothers and promotion of Brotherhood. ## TO SAFETY

This summer, I was fortunate enough to be part of a redefining moment in Chi Phi's history. As a Voting Delegate for the Rho Delta Chapter at the 154th Congress in Indianapolis, I was slated to be a part of the Member Education Committee and was then elected to be the Chairman by the other undergraduate Committee members.

We were given the task of reviewing Chi Phi's Personal Safety Policy and either editing it, or drafting a new document to bring Chi Phi up to date with NIC quidelines and other national fraternities.

The Fraternity's Associate Director of Risk Management, Ryan Lugabihl, spent time with myself and the Committee carefully going over two new proposed documents. After much discussion and debate about how to properly address our future, the Committee voted to propose the "Chi Phi Risk Management Policy."

Despite a small hiccup involving a necessary change to our National Bylaws, Congress voted unanimously on Sunday morning to adopt the new Policy. This was a great relief to myself, after I stayed up a few hours later than most the night before the last congressional session, checking and double checking our motion, reading over our national bylaws,

and brainstorming answers to every possible point of inquiry.

The most striking change in this new Policy over our previous one is the prohibition of hard liquor on Chapter premises and at Chapter events, unless being served by a licensed and insured third-party vendor. This has become a step every NIC organization has made in an effort to prevent rapid intoxication at Fraternity events, and is one which has proven successful.

Other changes of note include the explicit inclusion of Alumni and Alumni organizations in the Policy, making it clear that even after graduation, our standards have not diminished.


I am proud of the efforts that Congress and Chi Phi have made to ensure the continued safety of our Brothers and Friends, and I look forward to the year to come.

## Iota Delta Brother, Paleobiologist, Receives 2019 Cronkite Award

Since its establishment in 1990, the Walter Leland Cronkite, Jr. Award has been granted by the Grand Council to only nineteen Brothers whose humanitarian, social, or political achievement benefitted our country, educational system, or society. A governor, civil rights activist, Hollywood producer, US Senator, and Cronkite himself are among those honored these past three decades.



More than forty lota Delta Brothers and their guests made a special appearance at the Congressional Banquet on June 22 to honor Chi Phi's nineteenth recipient: Ronald L. Richards. lota Delta 1971.

Brother Richards is the first paleobiologist to be honored with the Cronkite Award. Since 1980, he has worked in various capacities with the Indiana State Museum in Indianapolis, working the way up to his current role as Senior Research Curator of Paleobiology. Among fifty-five years of experience with excavations are no fewer than

fourteen recoveries of mastodon fossils throughout Indiana.


In addition to his prolific fieldwork, Brother Richards has written extensively on Ice Age fauna with thirty works for the Indiana Academy of Science and seventy for other organizations, universities, geology clubs, and civic clubs in the state and nationwide. He has also served as a Grant Reviewer for the National Geographic Society and the National Science Foundation.

He has long credited his Chi Phi Brothers with fostering a love of excavation when they explored caves near Indiana University's campus together. During his acceptance speech at the Congressional Banquet, Brother Richards recounted the adventures with his lota Delta Chapter Brothers, many of whom were present to celebrate him. Through a career rooted in research and a commitment to better understanding of the world which once was in order to educate those around him, Brother Richards has displayed the Values of Chi Phi and a True Gentleman.

It is impressive to note that this year's scholarship winners have declared majors in a variety of fields, including pre-med, computer science, biology, engineering, economics, finance, and business. Many of the recipients have also logged a respectable number of community service hours with national and local organizations, while also having begun their professional journeys through summer internships and employment.

All scholarship applications are evaluated in the areas of: Grade Point Average, Leadership and Involvement, Community Service, Personal and Professional Aspirations, along with multiple letters of recommendation from professors, employers, and advisors. 
#### THE 2018 – 2019 ANNUAL REPORT of the CHI PHI **EDUCATIONAL** TRUST

## GAIN CHI PHI'S OLDEST HONOR

**Congratulations to our 2019 Sparks Memorial Medal recipients!** These twenty-five men represent some of Chi Phi's top scholars. First awarded in 1925, the Sparks Memorial Medal is named for Edwin Erle Sparks, Alpha-Chi 1884, lota 1884, and is the Chi Phi Educational Trust's oldest honor.

Awarded annually to the man in each Chapter with the highest academic standing, the Sparks Medal is a truly unique Chi Phi relic, incorporating representations from each of our three Founding Orders. The ribbon of scarlet and blue is symbolic of the ribbons affixed to charters issued by the Hobart Order. The medal itself is an embossed replica of the Princeton Order badge and bears the swords and stars emblematic of the Southern Order.

Brother Sparks proved himself to be a true Man of Virtue throughout his years as a Chi Phi and his professional career. He was an Initiate of our Alpha-Chi (then the Chi) Chapter at Ohio Wesleyan University, and after transferring to The Ohio State University, became a Charter Member of the lota Chapter.

His life after graduation became dedicated to education; he received graduate degrees from Harvard University, University of Chicago, and Lehigh University. During his tenure as a professor of history and dean at the University of Chicago, he was selected to lead Pennsylvania State University as president in 1908. He served in that capacity until 1920, leading Penn State through a period of great growth and its transition as a military encampment throughout World War I.

His service to Chi Phi as well knew no bounds. He served as Grand Gamma in 1886-1888, Alpha of Congress in 1921, and as Editor of The Chakett from 1922 until his untimely death. While Editor, Brother Sparks visited each Chapter at least twice. Apparently still not satisfied with his commitments after his retirement, he proved to be critical to the founding of our Alpha Delta Chapter at Penn State in 1924, mere months before he entered Chapter Eternal.

The men receiving the 2019 Sparks Medal have carried on Brother Sparks's reputation as a Man of Virtue and as men dedicated to their education.

On September 10, 2019, an era of Chi Phi history came to a close. Former Grand Eta and a truly great Chi Phi, George MacDonald, Kappa Delta 1971, lota Zeta 1989, Eta Theta 2011, entered Chapter Eternal peacefully in hospice care after a long and valiant battle with cancer.

Few – if any – Greek organizations are as fortunate as Chi Phi to have had a man so knowledgeable and passionate serve as chief legal counsel. In his unprecedented sixteen years of service as Grand Eta, George set into motion policies and practices that still guide our Fraternity to this day. Under his tutelage, our Fraternity always had a man of fierce intelligence to guide us through the often-choppy waters of modern fraternal existence. From his ideas regarding insurance, to his forward-thinking approach to risk management, George benefited his Brothers in ways that most will never fully know.

But most importantly, George was the living embodiment of our Fraternity's unwritten motto. Whether you had known him for forty years, or had just met him for the first time, you were sure to be greeted with his sly, infectious smile, and a hearty handshake. By many, he will perhaps be remembered best as "The Grand Reveler" for his persistent good spirit and constant reminders that we are, after all, a social organization.

For four decades, Brother MacDonald dedicated himself to our Brotherhood in a multitude of roles, both on the local level and on the national stage. His Chi Phi "career" began with his Initiation into the Kappa Delta Chapter at University of Rochester in 1968. He was instrumental to Kappa Delta's return to campus in 1987 and served as an officer of the Alumni Association for many years.

Brother MacDonald's desire to drive Chapters to succeed was not limited to his own; when the lota Zeta Chapter at George Mason University was Founded in 1987, he stepped in as an Advisor without hesitation. He did the same for the Eta Theta Chapter at University of Maryland, College Park in 2003 and helped establish the Sigma Theta Chapter at Towson University in 2015. He was also an avid proponent of the College of Excellence and served as a faculty volunteer throughout the 1990s.

Working with our undergraduate members was not the only way he defined himself throughout the years, as Brother MacDonald also found himself a driving force behind the National Capital Chi Phi Club in Washington, DC, just one of the ways which he ensured his Brothers had a social outlet. The Club today remains one of Chi Phi's longest standing and most active.

His presence at Chi Phi events across the country and his vast knowledge of the Fraternity did not go unnoticed; during the 1994 Congress in Rochester, the Delegates elected George

as Alpha of Congress. This would prove to be just the first National role he would take.


In 1997, Grand Alpha Jeff Velis, Alpha-Tau 1986, appointed Brother MacDonald to his first term as Grand Eta. The following two decades, much of it spent as the Fraternity's number two man, saw his service on the Grand Councils of four additional Grand Alphas: Steve Runkel, Omicron Delta 1975, Mu Zeta 1991; Ron Frank, Nu Delta 1983, Iota Zeta 1989, Delta Zeta 2000; Jim Soderquist, Alpha 1967, Epsilon 2014; and Bob Walker, Iota Delta 1970. Most recently, he served as a Member-at-Large from 2017 until his passing.

Throughout the changing times in Greek Life, Brother MacDonald always kept a level head and held Chi Phi on a steady course. When times changed and liability insurance became nearly impossible for fraternities to obtain, it was George who helped shepherd Chi Phi into the coverage we still use today. Suffice to say that his actions at that time helped protect our Brotherhood and our Brothers from a great deal of hardship.

The Chi Phi Educational Trust also found Brother MacDonald an invaluable resource and leader throughout his lifetime. In addition to serving as the Trust's Legal Counsel while Grand Eta, Brother MacDonald served as a member of the Board of Governors, as a Trustee, and as Treasurer. His leadership throughout a tumultuous time in the economy greatly contributed to the Trust's continued success.

He was always eager to lend an ear and advice to any Brother in need, no matter who or when, and his drive to work alongside our undergraduate Brothers to promote their health and safety was always at the forefront of his mind. In that spirit, in 2017 the 152nd Chi Phi Congress voted unanimously to establish the George M. MacDonald Risk Manager of the Year Award in his honor. This is just one tangible way in which George will be memorialized within our Brotherhood.

#### The true embodiment of a Gentleman and a Chi Phi, Brother MacDonald will be missed by all.





As Greek life has evolved throughout the past two centuries, Chi Phi Fraternity has remained resolute in our mission to **Build Better Men.** Chi Phi's success and advancements in recent decades can be attributed to our uncompromising commitment to the words of the Chi Phi Creed that have guided generations of Brothers to live by the Chi Phi Way. Chi Phi's Creed is a constant reminder of our Founders' vision, values and principles that served as the foundations from which Chi Phi Fraternity and Chi Phi Educational Trust was built.

Although the Educational Trust was initially established to raise support for our scholarship program, the Fraternity has since evolved over time and has faced various turning points within this past century. Brothers, Alumni, family, friends and companies answered the call to help fellow Brothers, Chapters and Colonies in those times of need through gifts donated to the Educational Trust. The generous and unrestricted gifts

have helped the Educational Trust sustain funding for our scholarship program and also expand our support of new Chi Phi educational resources throughout the years.

Our Fraternity has reached a pivotal turning point today that may perhaps be our most defining moment yet in Chi Phi's history. Social fraternities continue to encounter unrelenting scrutiny and challenges on campuses across the country while undergraduate and graduate students currently face tremendous social, mental, academic and financial pressures that can negatively impact their college experience and their futures. #### WE BELIEVE that a stronger Chi Phi shall be our reward.

In response to the current challenges Fraternities face, including Chi Phi, the Educational Trust partnered with the Chi Phi Grand Council leadership to identify our Brothers', Chapters' and Colonies most pressing educational needs today. As a result, and in alignment with our Creed, the Educational Trust established the Men of Virtue Fund. The Men of Virtue Fund is reflective of the Educational Trust's renewed vision and educational priorities for our annual fund as Educational Trust Chairman and Men of Virtue Fund founding donor David L. Skelton, Omega 1980, further explained, "The educational needs of our Brothers and Fraternity today are extensive. The Educational Trust recognized that the development of a collaborative, comprehensive strategy was imperative to understand how we could best help and convey these priorities to our donors, Brothers and the larger Chi Phi community. Together, we have the opportunity and collective capability to support new and future generations of Brothers as they seek to become better students, leaders and citizens through Chi Phi's educational programs and initiatives. Increased unrestricted support from our Brothers and donors will provide the financial resources needed to sustain and enhance these programs in the years ahead, which will ultimately strengthen our Fraternity."

The Educational Trust was honored to announce the launch of our Men of Virtue Fund inaugural campaign at the 154th Congress this summer. As part of the launch, Educational Trust Chairman Brother Skelton outlined the Educational Trust's priority initiatives that will benefit from gifts made to the Men of Virtue Fund including leadership education programs, leadership travel grants, scholarship awards, staff resources as well as history and heritage programs.


#### **Leadership Education Programs**

The Educational Trust firmly believes in supporting our Officers' and Brothers' participation in Chi Phi's leadership education programs by ensuring that these programs are offered to our Brothers at no cost to them, with the exception of travel expenses. Transformative leadership programs, such as the Regional Leadership Alliance and Alphas and Thetas Academy, are at the forefront of helping equip our Brothers with relevant training sessions as well as mentorship and networking opportunities that will further empower our Chi Phi members

as they lead each Chapter and Colony. These programs provide the necessary guidance, counsel and connections that benefit so many of our Brothers as emerging leaders, students and citizens, and it is an experience that our Brothers will carry with them long after graduation. The impact of these programs is not only evident through our Brothers' compelling experiences as participants, but also through the record-breaking program attendance figures that are reported each year. Unrestricted gifts made to the Men of Virtue Fund will support the Educational Trust's efforts to meet the increasing demand for these programs that help our Brothers advance as leaders and strengthen our Chapters and Colonies.

#### **Leadership Travel Grants**

While Chi Phi hosts leadership education programs throughout the country and in cities that are centrally located, our Brothers must often travel in order to participate in these programs. When possible, our Brothers' own Chapters and Colonies will pay for travel expenses related to these programs, if they have the budget to cover these expenses. When a Chapter or Colony does not have the funds to cover travel fees, Brothers are faced with covering these significant expenses themselves. The Educational Trust is proud to offer leadership travel grants for Brothers who need financial support to help pay for these specific travel expenses through an application process. To date, all of these grant requests have been met. As participation in our leadership education programs increases, however, our Brothers' travel expenses will increase as well, and we

recognize that not all Chapters and Colonies will have the funds in the future to cover these fees. Unrestricted donations made to the Men of Virtue Fund will support the Educational Trust's leadership travel grants; ensuring that we eliminate any financial barriers that would prevent our Brothers from participating in Chi Phi's leadership education programs.

#### **Scholarship Awards**

Since our founding, the Educational Trust has always valued the opportunity to recognize our Brothers' academic achievements, leadership, service and contributions to our Fraternity through our scholarship program. Merit-based scholarship awards remain one of the Educational Trust's top funding priorities to this day. Tuition rates have increased more than 150% in the last 30 years and student debt is at an all-time high. Many of our undergraduate and graduate Brothers and their families carry a heavy burden in paying for their college education, at times taking on more work and making sacrifices to cover these expenses. Now, more than ever before, our Brothers need scholarship support.

The Educational Trust is uniquely positioned to help provide financial relief from high tuition bills and textbook fees while recognizing our Brothers' accomplishments through our own scholarship program. Our current scholarship awards range in monetary value starting at \$1,200 up to \$2,700. For many Brothers, an Educational Trust scholarship award can mean the difference between spending more time working one or two jobs outside of their school commitments and, instead, dedicating more time to their studies and their service through Chi Phi. For other Brothers, an Educational Trust scholarship award often helps reduce the size of their student loan debt. Ultimately, every Educational Trust scholarship recipient is positively impacted by our scholarships and the message of

genuine support that each award represents.

In light of the mounting financial pressures that our Brothers currently face as college students, there is an unprecedented need to increase our scholarship funding in the months and years ahead. While we are grateful for the sustained support that has helped fuel our scholarship program in previous decades, the Educational Trust is currently limited in the number of applicants we can support each year, due to funding needed for other educational priorities. At this time, the Educational Trust can only award scholarships to approximately 20% of our applicants each year. Through additional, unrestricted gifts made to the Men of Virtue Fund, the Educational Trust will have the capacity to increase the number of scholarships that we award to our deserving Brothers each year.

#### **Staff resources**

Chi Phi Fraternity staff dedicate countless hours and resources that guide our Chapters and Colonies, and at times, help them forge new paths when they are met with difficult and serious challenges. Chi Phi leadership consultants provide a wealth of support and counsel to Chapter and Colony Officers and Brothers, oftentimes visiting to offer onsite training and mentorship for Chi Phi Officers and members. Chi Phi staff also lead the planning efforts behind all of Chi Phi's educational programs that help fulfill our mission and instill Chi Phi's values within all of our Brothers. As Chi Phi's membership grows and our Chapters and Colonies press on, despite complex campus cultures, the Educational Trust acknowledges that an accessible team of Fraternity staff members is paramount to our Fraternity's future because of the educational resources that they continually provide our Brothers, Chapters and Colonies. As the driving force behind our Fraternity, unrestricted support raised through the Men of Virtue Fund will help support the efforts of Chi Phi staff as they work towards strengthening the bonds of Brotherhood within each Chapter and Colony.

#### **History and Heritage Programs**

Chi Phi has a storied legacy as the oldest social Fraternity in our country. As Brothers, our history and heritage initiatives remind us that our bond is strengthened by learning from our past as we pursue a brighter future for Chi Phi. In the words of Scholarship Committee member and Men of Virtue Fund founding donor Douglas Howie, Mu 1983, "Never forget where you came from. Once a Chi Phi always a Chi Phi until the very end."

The opportunity to better understand our Fraternity's evolution, accomplishments and Ritual is made possible through Chi Phi's distinguished Regional Ritual Retreat. Created



by a Chi Phi Brother more than four years ago and presented exclusively by Brothers and Alumni, the Regional Ritual Retreat is a compelling educational experience offered to our Brothers each year that deepens their understanding of Chi Phi and encourages them to live by the Chi Phi Way. Unrestricted gifts made to the Men of Virtue Fund will help ensure that the Regional Ritual Retreat continues in the future and that our Brothers may participate in this inspiring educational program at no cost to them, with the exception of travel.

Chi Phi has also made tremendous strides in the physical preservation of our past through an innovative digital archives project. The digital archives project is designed to protect and preserve more than 2 million Chapter documents, important relics and photos that are currently stored within the Greek Life Museum. While donors may allocate funding to preserve their own Chapter's collection, unrestricted gifts to the Men of Virtue Fund will help support the preservation of select national Fraternity documents and photos. These Chi Phi treasures will be featured as part of our Fraternity's digital database that will be accessible to current and future generations of Brothers, from anywhere in the world.

#### WE BELIEVE in the victory of continual existence.

Following the launch of the Men of Virtue Fund at Congress in June, more than 80 Brothers, Alumni, family, friends and companies have generously donated unrestricted gifts in support of the Fund's inaugural campaign. Together, these founding donors have contributed more than \$69,000 to date. It is evident through the donations received thus far that our Brothers, Alumni and Chi Phi community understand the significant needs of our Fraternity today, as expressed by Former Grand Alpha and founding donor to the Men of Virtue Fund Brother Richard Gilbert, Rho 1962: "Unrestricted gifts made to the Chi Phi Educational Trust need to increase to meet the growing number of educational priorities in our Fraternity. In the months and the years ahead, unrestricted support will remain vital to our Fraternity's position as the nation's leading social fraternity. historic fraternity **Build Better Men**. That was the vision of our founders at Princeton 200 years ago, and that is a goal I embrace today. Our need for men of virtue in Chi Phi, in the modern era, is as great as ever. Our future as a college social fraternity is at stake. That's what motivates me to support this endeavor."

The Men of Virtue Fund's founding donors have provided a significant foundation of support for the most important educational needs of our Fraternity today. Building upon this momentum, the Men of Virtue Fund will serve as the Educational Trust's annual fund campaign; providing the Educational Trust an opportunity to continually highlight and raise unrestricted support for Chi Phi's educational priorities.


