



GIVEN TO THIRTY-ONE BROTHERS


The Chi Phi Educational Trust is proud to introduce our 2020 Sparks Memorial Medal recipients! First awarded in 1925, the Sparks Memorial Medal is named for Edwin Erle Sparks, Alpha-Chi 1884, lota 1884, and is the Chi Phi Educational Trust's oldest honor. It is given every year to the man with the highest academic standing in each Chapter.

The Sparks Medal is a truly unique Chi Phi relic, incorporating representations from each of our three Founding Orders. The ribbon of scarlet and blue is symbolic of the ribbons affixed to charters issued by the Hobart

Order. The medal itself is an embossed replica of the Princeton Order badge and bears the swords and stars emblematic of the Southern Order.

These thirty-one True Gentlemen represent some of Chi Phi's top scholars. Their academic merits are not the only thing which demonstrates their outstanding character; this year's Sparks Medals have been awarded to Brothers distinguished as Trust scholarship recipients, Chapter Officers, and campus leaders.

H. Parks Helms, Alpha-Alpha 1959, donated the extent of his life's work to the archives at UNC Charlotte, where they will remain available out of the public interest due to his many years of commitment to the local government and his community. A graduate of UNC Chapel Hill, Brother Helms served as a member of the North Carolina House of Representatives for ten years and on the Mecklenburg County Board of Commissioners for sixteen, during which he played a critical role in Charlotte's development into the major metropolitan center that it is today. He also served in various capacities with state and local committees, nonprofit organizations, and legal organizations in North Carolina. Retirement from politics came for Brother Helms in 2010 when he left to continue work as president of his law firm.

David AJ Ostermeyer, Omicron Delta 1980, reports on the Class of 1980 from Miami University (of Ohio):

COVID has put all colleges in turmoil, understanding that college bound students are feeling the pain of online training and missing out on the college experience inclusion of fraternity life. Chi Phi Brothers in ARTS & MEDIA

The Fraternity is fortunate to have a long list of Brothers throughout our history who have partaken in the arts and media through performance, writing, and creation. The following highlights are just a taste of what our Brothers have been up to. So, if you are looking for a new book to pick up or maybe a show to binge on this fall, be sure to check out our own Brothers' work!

Dan Bakkedahl, Nu Delta 1993, has continued his comedy acting career in Netflix's new series, Space Force, alongside Steve Carrell. Brother Bakkedahl plays Secretary of Defense John Blandsmith, one of Carrell's superiors in the show. He has also appeared in regular roles in acclaimed shows such as Veep, Life in Pieces, and The Daily Show with Jon Stewart.

Cliff Cordy, PhD, Epsilon Delta 1959, is working toward a 2021 release for a trilogy on his unique and eventful life. His first focuses on "My Life as an Engineer," working with the big names such as Apple and HP. His second, "My Life as an Athlete," chronicles is athletic accomplishments in his recordsetting years at Oregon State up through his 2015 gold medal win for the Triathlon at the World Masters Athletics Championships in the 75-age bracket. This third is more laid back, "My Life as a Traveler."

Ryan Haddad, Alpha-Chi 2015, had his Netflix debut last fall with the release of The Politician, a comedy-drama now in its second season. Brother Haddad plays a recurring character who works with the series lead in his political campaigns throughout both seasons. He has previously performed in self-directed off-Broadway shows which have been well-reviewed by critics.

Adam Litwin, Kappa Delta 2001, and his father Bennett Litwin wrote, produced, and acted in their film Frackers, released online and available through Vimeo. A lawyer by trade, Brother Litwin and his father have pursued screenplay for some time, and this was their first film together. They formed their own production company, Laughing Dragon Entertainment, LLC, for the venture.

Richard "RJ" MacDonald, Lambda 1987, published an historical fiction work titled A Distant Field: A Novel of World War I. The book focuses on two Scots-American brothers who find themselves deep in the war in Europe. Brother MacDonald's work has been recognized as the 2019 winner in Military Fiction by the Independent Press Awards, 2019 Gold Medal Winner in Historical Fiction by the Military Writers Society of America, and as a 2019 Finalist in Military Fiction by the American Fiction Awards.

Guy Seabrook, Eta 1969, is celebrating the recent success of his work In The Nam, which follows a young pilot flying missions during the Vietnam War. For three months, the book was #1 under new releases and at one point was #1 in all three of its categories: Weapons & Warfare History, Vietnam War Biographies, and Air Force Biographies. Brother Seabrook is himself a pilot and veteran of the Vietnam War.



Laurence "Larry" Trotter II, Kappa 1977, published a book this July on what he describes as his "lifetime of miracles" titled Seeing the Light through Black Death: Salvation in the African Savannah. The book chronicles his life, but focuses around the healing which took place after Brother Trotter was attacked by a cape buffalo in South Africa in 2012 – an animal referred to by

locals as "The Black Death" which can weigh in excess of 2,000 pounds. Brother Trotter is a Chi Phi Legacy through his late father, Laurence Trotter, Kappa 1952.

It was sixty-three years ago that I pledged the Gamma Chapter of Chi Phi. Sixty-one years ago that my steady girlfriend was elected sweetheart of Gamma. This lucky guy married the sweetheart fifty-six years ago, on Emory University's campus with our reception in the Chi Phi House, Tom Connelly Hall.

That set out for our fifty-six year adventure together. She zip lined over Victoria Falls Gorge in 2013, at age seventy-four. I bungee jumped over Queenstown, New Zealand, at age seventy-two. My Chi Phi little brother is arranging a reunion with my fraternity-days best buddy, now in Virginia, and his little brother, now in North Carolina. Collectively, we four Brothers will have 244 years of proud Chi Phi Brotherhood, and at least that many old stories and lies to retell.

Staying connected to these cherished memories and abiding Brotherhood friendships means even more with the passing of years. At age eighty-one and with my beloved wife, the 1959 sweetheart, now in an Alzheimer's facility, I survey those Chi Phi years and the great Brotherhood friendships enjoyed even today, and count my Gamma experience as one of my life's greatest blessings.

A Turning Point

A standing family tradition for **Fred Smith, lota 1950**, says that the passage of time is often defined by turning points; birthdays, graduations, special honors, or meeting special people who change the course of lives in unpredictable ways. Such was the case with a high school teacher who recognized a tall, long-legged student with an excess of energy, as a potential star athlete.

The high school was in Metuchen, New Jersey, a poor town with a poor high school that had no athletic facilities to channel all the energy of high school kids into playing sports. There was no track for runners and jumpers, a fact that one teacher decided to confront. He set up hurdles in the hallways at intervals and taught Fred the fine points of running the high hurdles on the hallways' hardwood floors.

After two years of hall hurdling Fred's family moved to Cincinnati, where the high school was endowed with a fine running track. Fred excelled at the 120 yard high hurdles race. His father never missed watching him race and even the Track and Field coach at The Ohio State University was a frequent spectator; Larry Snyder had coached the Olympic star Jesse Owens, and told Fred one day after a race, "Son, if you ever want to come to Ohio State just call me!"

In 1943, Fred was drafted into the Army. He spent the next four years in the military and eventually transferred to the air base in Amarillo, Texas, where he was spotted in a track meet by the base commander, who commandeered Fred to play football for the Army instead.


After this quite unorthodox military service, Fred was discharged along with thousands of others, many of whom returned to civilian life eager to take advantage of the free college tuition offered through the GI Bill. Fred seized this opportunity to continue his education, but found that the challenge was to find a college that had room for him. His parents had relocated again, this time to Connecticut, where Fred began his search. There was little resemblance, however, between the Quonset hut lodging being offered by many colleges under the GI Bill and the fraternity houses Fred had been looking forward to. Tales of college being the best years of your life just weren't coming true.

Because he still loved to run, Fred thought of Ohio State and Coach Snyder's words. It seemed like a long shot, but worth a try. So, he got on the phone and reached Coach Snyder, who listened intently as Fred recollected their last encounter. His reply was simple, "Give me your phone number, Smith, and I will call you back." Fred was pretty sure that was the end of his long shot pipe dream, but sure enough, the coach called back in a half hour with the news: "Son, you're in Ohio State!"

The invitation included living at the coach's home until he found a fraternity to join. The coach actually took him around to the fraternities until Fred lost at a poker game and decided to join that fraternity as the only way to get his money back. And thus, Fred joined Chi Phi's lota Chapter in 1947. He dedicated himself to both his Brothers and his athletic career throughout his college years.

The hero responsible for this most important turning point in the life of Brother Smith was the resourceful teacher at Metuchen High, to whom Fred is ever grateful. He just doesn't remember the teacher's name!

Light Shines on Beta Brother in Chapter Eternal



Dr. Francisco "Paco" Gutierrez, Beta 1975, a native of Cuba, came to the United States in 1961 at the age of eight as part of "Operation Peter Pan," which airlifted some 14,000 unaccompanied minors out of the country. After finishing school in Puerto Rico, Paco attended MIT, where he joined the Beta Chapter and served as Alpha his senior year. After graduating in 1975 with a dual bachelor's and master's degrees in chemical engineering, he returned to Puerto Rico. There, he met the love of his life, Suzanne Teissoniere, and together they raised their three children: Gilberto, Suzanne, and Roxanne.

Later life found Paco furthering his education with an MBA from the University of Puerto Rico in 1992 and a PhD from Walden University in 2017. His professional experience included work with some of the most notable chemical engineering companies in existence. And in the 1990s, he served as a professor of chemistry at the Interamerican University of Puerto Rico. Until the day he passed, he repeatedly and proudly proclaimed his unconditional love for the Beta Chapter and MIT.

When Paco entered Chapter Eternal on July 22, 2018, his Chapter Brothers rallied to find a way to honor his memory. It was quickly decided that a stained glass enhancement of the laylight that illuminates the central stairway of the Chapter House — originally built in 1886 — would be fitting project.

In a matter of weeks, more than forty Beta Chapter Alumni pulled funds together for the project; most of them were close friends of Paco, but others stepped forward after learning about the ambitious undertaking. The Beta Foundation owes a special thank you to **Dr. David Olive, Beta 1975**, and **John Coffman, Beta 1966**, for their generous contributions.

Our Alumni formed a committee led by **Dr. Dave Neuburger**, **Beta 1975**, to help guide the project. The committee soon determined that with the funds available, they could replace all nine panels of the laylight and lit with a modern LED system — far beyond the original scope of their task. Brothers were largely inspired by the Chapter House's "Oval Room," where recent renovations had uncovered a parquet inlay in the wood floor reminiscent of our own chakett.

Installed in January with the assistance of some undergraduate Brothers, the final product was revealed at Beta's annual Alumni Banquet on February 22, 2020. In attendance were Paco's wife and children, who made the journey from Puerto Rico, Miami, and New York to witness the event. In spite of the bitter Boston winter the banquet boasted the largest contingent of Beta Brothers ever assembled, numbering more than 200. Each of them was delighted to see Paco's legacy live on, thanks to the generosity and effort of our Brothers.






Though life on campus may look drastically different from years past, things at the National Office are as busy as ever. Looking

THETA CHAPTER AT RENSSELAER POLYTECHNIC INSTITUTE

Here at the Theta Chapter, we have faced adversity in light of changing policies with the school that has forced fraternities to the periphery on top of issues faced with COVID-19. In spite of these challenges, our Chapter has grown and persevered. The dedication of every single Brother to our Chapter is one of the pillars that keeps this Chapter standing.

Academics is an offshoot of this dedication as it is one of the most important tenets of our Chapter. This year, our overall GPA increased to be above the All-Men's and All-Greek Average. This was in part due to greater involvement among Brothers to tutor and collaborate on assignments.

We also hold philanthropy in high regard as Brothers continue to reach out to our community. In Fall 2019, Brothers took the opportunity to volunteer their time by helping with cleanup at a local homeless kitchen. On top of this, Brothers volunteered themselves to a local 5K race. Last year, the RPI Greek community helped us raise over \$20,000 for the St. Baldrick's Foundation, a pediatric cancer research entity, of which \$10,000 was raised directly by the Theta Chapter. Although our annual St. Baldrick's event was canceled this year due to COVID concerns, Brothers have continued to raise money and awareness so that next year's event is even bigger. This fall, we plan on doing everything we can to stay connected to the community by helping with organizing at a local food bank and potentially volunteering at a nearby park.

Maintaining and repairing the Chapter facilities has also been a major priority for Brothers. The Brotherhood pours in hours of effort to maintain the property our houses are located on, providing lawn care as well as upkeep to the exterior common areas and storage. With financial assistance from our Housing Corporation, we were also able to finance an updated roof for Stroud Hall. Brothers have also provided their time and effort into renovating various common spaces in our houses as well as our bathrooms.

This was a difficult year for recruitment, with updated mandates for Deferred Recruitment beginning last fall for the foreseeable future as well as COVID-19 regulations. In spite of these challenges, we welcomed nine men into the ranks of the Men of 1824. 


University of Tampa Colony welcomed three New

We are proud of their unyielding dedication to the core values of our beloved Fraternity during these challenging times, and we are beyond grateful for their valiant efforts to ensure the health and safety of us all.





Michael Collings, lota Theta 2020 Schreiner University Case Investigation Lead UTHealth School of Public Health

Prior to his current role, Brother Collings worked the registration desk at a local emergency room. He remembers the ER being a ghost town early in the pandemic. However, by June the ER was busier than it had ever been. People shifted from being fearful of contracting the virus to overridden with anxiety that they were infected. The uptick in patients quickly became challenging for all hospital staff as they, too, were trying to adapt to the everchanging protocols and procedures: A task that swiftly became taxing as personal protective equipment was hard to obtain.

Now as a Case Investigation Lead working within San Antonio, Texas,

Brother Collings assists families who have received a positive COVID-19 diagnosis. Through the support of UTHealth, the city, and the CARES Act, families are offered shelter, food, and other basic necessities in order to adhere to the strict fourteen-day quarantine policy. Collings has found himself inspired through this process and more committed than ever to his passion for Public Health. He notes that despite the negativity and fear surrounding the virus, he has witnessed a great deal of good; food pantries have been established all over the city with shelves consistently stocked with food and an overwhelming number of people volunteering. When asked how he would describe the past few months, Brother Collings simply replied with "resiliency in the face of adversity." It is no surprise that his advice to fellow Brothers is uplifting and encouraging:

"Keep your spirits up! Don't let everything get you down; focus on the positive of this experience. It may be difficult right now, but for public health [social distancing] is what needs to happen."



Sgt. Michael Gonzalez, Lambda Zeta 1998 St. Mary's University Crime Scene Investigator Dallas Police Department

With more than twenty-three years on the police force, eighteen of those served in the forensics department, Brother Gonzalez has seen his fair share of grisly crime scenes. Though he has learned over the years how to mentally prepare himself for what he might encounter on scene, the fear of contracting COVID-19 has been a challenging force to reckon with.

"Despite a pandemic, crime doesn't stop." Brother Gonzalez has found himself at crime scenes, in the forensics lab, and training up-and-coming officers day in and day out. His job inherently requires him to be around people all day (with social distancing not really an option), so he quickly began wearing personal protective equipment from start

to end of his shift regardless of whether he was in the lab or in the field. Unfortunately, a large portion of the police force has contracted COVID-19, so he has also found himself covering additional shifts and helping to shoulder the burden of extra work as colleagues quarantine and recover.

Brother Gonzalez has been fortunate to not test positive for the virus so far, and his wife (who is a stay-at-home mother to their three children) is ensuring that continues. With strict sanitizing procedures in place prior to him even entering the house, Gonzalez is hoping not only to perform his duties as a Police Officer protecting the citizens of his city, but also keep his family safe and healthy. His advice to others perfectly reflects this mentality:

"Respect the guidelines; your health needs to be a top priority right now. Also, focus on school. Take pride in the work you submit and respect yourself and others during this time."





Richy Hidalgo, Nu Delta 2019 Florida State University Physical Therapy Technician, Intensive Care Unit

"Help wherever needed": Brother Hidalgo's personal mantra and one that he implemented at the start of the pandemic. When his hospital asked the Physical Therapy Department for volunteers to assist with COVID-19 patients, Hidalgo volunteered immediately. He naively thought it would be a great experience; he never imagined how humbling and life altering it would truly be.

Brother Hidalgo began his time in physical therapy working in an outpatient setting with athletes and other individuals who were, overall, in great health.

However, as the virus quickly progressed, he found himself working on the hospital floor caring for COVID-19 positive patients. Those first few weeks were particularly challenging as he struggled to get accustomed to the extensive personal protective equipment required and the intense 90-degree (Fahrenheit) heat of the hospital floor (as it is believed that heat is a deterrent to the spread of the virus).

Instead of watching an athlete recover from a torn ACL, Hidalgo was now celebrating a patient's ability to simply raise an arm above their head.

Standing up, brushing teeth, and even smiling were major milestones for those battling COVID-19. When envisioning his physical therapy career, he never once thought it would include finding implicit joy in coloring and having simple conversations with patients slowly recovering from a deadly virus during a global pandemic. Yet to watch a patient at his absolute worst battle for his life while the virus wreaked havoc on his body, to walking out the doors of the hospital months later has been an experience that will never be paralleled.

It's no surprise that when asked what advice he had for Brothers, he responded with this message: "I can't stress it enough—keep your mask on out of respect for others. If you can't keep it on because it's unbearable—stay inside. You've got to keep the mask on over your nose, keep a bottle of hand sanitizer with you, and please wash your hands."



Benjamin Hopper, Rho Delta 2019 Oglethorpe University Medical Assistant, Urgent Care Facility

In April of 2020, Brother Hopper witnessed the conversion of his urgent care facility to a COVID-19 testing site. Though one of the essential elements of his job remained the

same (performing diagnostic tests), the general practices of his work altered drastically. No longer did he have the opportunity to converse with patients, comfort them, or answer their questions. Instead, he stood outside and performed COVID-19 tests curbside. He never imagined practicing medicine "drive-thru" style, let alone being at the heart of a global pandemic. At the peak of the outbreak, he tested up to 500 people a week with more than 100 of those tests coming back positive. He has witnessed first-hand the effects this virus can have on individuals, but he remains steadfast in his commitment to medicine. Brother Hopper's advice to Brothers is a true testament of his faith in humanity:

"Take the compassion and love you have for your Brothers and turn it into compassion and love to do what is safe for them and stay distanced."



Michael LeBlanc, Lambda Theta 2008 University of Massachusetts Dartmouth Staff Nurse, Emergency Department

Though he initially thought that COVID-19 would not have much of an impact here in the United States, Michael LeBlanc quickly realized that would, unfortunately, not be the case. As harrowing stories from Italy began to emerge, the hospital in which he serves as an emergency department nurse quickly began changing protocols, updating policies, and trying to secure necessary resources. However, once he and the staff treated the first COVID-19 positive patient, everything changed even more drastically.

Medical personnel immediately started wearing masks (even though patients were not yet asked to do the same), and staff began to question how best to utilize the limited resources they had. The main concern was that the hospital only had three negative pressure rooms, which are necessary for intubation. Needless to say, it was not long until the overwhelming impact of this virus hit hard.

Unfortunately, Brother LeBlanc tested positive for COVID-19 in April after treating an asymptomatic patient. He, his wife, and two young daughters all contracted the virus and spent weeks suffering from stomach pains, fatigue, and nasal congestion. While Brother LeBlanc has returned to work after being out for a month, hospital staff are to this day still testing positive for the virus. LeBlanc's message to family, friends, and fellow Brothers is simple:

"Wash your hands and wear your mask. Keep gatherings limited in both frequency and number of those attending."





Dr. Ray Pryor, Xi Delta 1993 Florida Institute of Technology Physician, Elder Care Facilities

Nursing homes and similar facilities have been traditionally underserviced and underfunded; this was a fact on the forefront of his mind when Brother Pryor left trauma surgery to become a wound care specialist for elder care facilities in the Chicago area a decade ago. And, while he has still managed to practice medicine despite the insufficient resources, the lack of personal protective equipment became a major point of concern once the pandemic swept through twenty of the twenty-one facilities he serves daily.

Brother Pryor has witnessed firsthand the traumatic effects of COVID-19. He has observed the death of more than a dozen elderly patients, the loss of two young colleagues, as well as increased feelings of depression and abandonment among his patients. Once allowed, families did their best to visit relatives through windows and in parking lots; however, the masks made it difficult for elderly patients to recognize who had come to visit.

And whereas Pryor has strong words of caution for Brothers, he is focusing on the silver lining of the pandemic: Nursing homes will finally receive the long overdue recognition they deserve. This should, hopefully, bring with it ample resources and higher pay for staff.

"Take this seriously. Be part of the solution, not part of the problem. It is tough to be in school and not go to parties, but this is real, and this is deadly."



Dr. Steve Rossman, Pi Zeta 2004 SUNY Binghamton Physician, Hackensack University Medical Center

As news of the novel coronavirus began to spread, Brother Rossman thought to himself "Is this real? This is probably just the flu...right?" It didn't take long for him to realize that it was, in fact, not an influenza outbreak, but rather a global pandemic that marked New Jersey as a hot zone. With Hackensack University Medical Center treating an astronomical number of positive virus cases, the entire hospital was quickly converted into a COVID-19 facility.

For Dr. Rossman, he went from running a successful orthopedic practice to, essentially, being shut down. Since elective surgeries were cancelled at the height of the pandemic, he was only allowed to see patients that were in dire need. He and his colleagues wanted to help in the frontline effort and since they "couldn't help with brains" they decided to "help with biceps." He and a few other orthopedic surgeons joined the Prone Team where they helped to turn intubated patients from their stomach to their back in an attempt to prevent stiffness and bedsores.

However, Brother Rossman is not the only member of his family being exposed to COVID-19 on a daily basis; his wife is also a physician. With two small children at home, managing work schedules and trying to ensure their family stayed healthy and safe became what felt like an insurmountable challenge. Yet, what Brother Rossman remembers the most from these past several months is the gratitude that complete strangers have shown him. As he stood in the middle of an empty grocery store aisle, still wearing his scrubs, shoppers began to approach him and simply say "thank you" - acts of kindness that will not be forgotten.

Elective surgeries have begun again in New Jersey, and Brother Rossman is happy to engage in a bit of normalcy - even if strict procedures are still in place. With all the sickness and death he has witnessed since March, his words of advice to others is quite simple: "It's not uncool to wear a mask; it will save your life and others."



Jake Shandy, Xi Theta 2021 Southern Utah University Retail Worker, Cedar City, Utah

Brother Shandy will never forget walking into the grocery store at the start of his shift one March morning and seeing shelves completely empty. Hundreds of angry and panicked customers were packed into the store causing complete chaos. As the next few weeks and months progressed, sadly, not much changed. Shelves remained empty, customers remained angry, and employees remained exhausted.

Even now, six months later, Clorox wipes, rubbing alcohol, and other cleaning supplies are hard to come by; customers are still hostile, demanding, and impatient; and Brother Shandy, along with the rest of his coworkers, is tired from the forty-plus-hour work weeks at his part time job. He has witnessed customers refuse to wear a mask or wear one correctly, and at a particular low point, he observed a customer in a fit of anger intentionally cough on individuals in his vicinity.

There is no doubt that this pandemic has not brought out the best in



everyone, but Brother Shandy reminds us that being kind, saying "thank you," and simply following health guidelines can have a formidable impact. This experience has also served as a powerful reminder to focus on mental health. Brother Shandy reflects on the stress and anxiety simply going to work has caused him and his co-workers. Now, more than ever, it's imperative that you take care of yourself while also doing what you can to take care of others: "Be polite, keep your distance, and if you are struggling in any way reach out for help!"



Capt. Patrick Trippany, Sigma Zeta 1998 University at Albany Firefighter/EMT, Albany, New York

When a 911 call is received, First
Responders in Albany come out in
full force. Within minutes multiple
emergency medical technicians, an
ambulance, the police department,
a large firetruck, and two-man
paramedic firetruck (which is where
you will find Brother Trippany) will
be on the scene. Despite COVID-19
sweeping through the state of New
York, this dedication to the safety of
the town's citizens never changed.
What did change, however, was

What did change, however, was the look and feel of the entire process. Brother Trippany and his colleagues must wear additional protective gear, and there is a slight delay in entering homes as they need to first assess whether or not there could be exposure to COVID-19. Then there is also the sense of unease that comes from the unknown - especially early in the pandemic when procedures and protocols were changing almost daily. In fact, just a few months ago, fortytwo out of two hundred and sixty firefighters were guarantined after testing positive for the virus. Brother Trippany has been fortunate not to contract the virus; however, colleagues of his on an opposite shift were not so fortunate. As a result, he and others pulled 48-hour shifts (as opposed to their typical 24-hour shifts) to compensate for those recovering, and stringent cleaning measures were implemented at the beginning of every shift to reduce exposure.

The past few months have also brought some moments of gratitude. Back in April, Trippany was promoted to Captain. There was no large ceremony nor photographers to commemorate the occasion, just a small gathering of those dear to him. When asked what has resonated with him the most these past several months he responded, "everyone came together-even in the beginning. None of us knew what was going to happen tomorrow, but people really came together through all this." So, what words of advice does he have to share with his Brothers? He responded very succinctly with, "This is real. Whatever city you live in, please adhere to the precautions because this is very real. Let's get through this together now, so we don't have to deal with it later!"



Rev. Michael Casey Woolf, Phi Delta 2010 The University of Tennessee, Knoxville Senior Minister, Evanston, Illinois

As the world has grappled with the barrage of news stories revolving around COVID-19, many people have searched for a way to aid those most impacted by the virus. As such, Brother Woolf wasted no time in taking action. Knowing that at a time like this connection to each other, one's faith, and the community were paramount, Brother Woolf understood that Zoom worship services would not suffice



for all of his parishioners. Working in conjunction with the non-profit organization that also operates within the building, he agreed to use the congregation space for those in need of emergency housing.

Over the course of the past six months, more than one hundred people have sought shelter at this location. This temporary "home" has been pivotal as other resources typically available are currently closed. Brother Woolf takes great pride in his congregation's renewed devotion to homelessness advocacy, a strengthened connection to the non-profit operating within its space, and the gratitude and purpose that came with doing "measurable good" in the midst of a global pandemic. As so many have felt helpless during this time, he is glad to have offered his parishioners a chance to make a positive impact. As Brother Woolf reflects: "A pandemic doesn't stop folks from becoming homeless; I'm just glad we stepped up and responded to the call."



Blake Davis, Mu Theta 2014 University of the Incarnate Word Firefighter/EMT, Houston, Texas

Demonstrating the values at the core of the Fraternity, Brother Davis has exemplified the very definition of a True Gentleman. Long before the world became aware of what the novel coronavirus even was, Brother Davis was working as a firefighter and emergency medical technician. Once the pandemic struck close to home, Davis volunteered to cover extra shifts. His particular station is understaffed and many of the other firefighters have families that are considered high risk. To help ease their concern and ensure that public safety was never compromised, he selflessly offered to step in for them.

Thirteen-hour shifts, six days a week quickly became the norm for Brother DeBassio once the pandemic struck. Being employed at a Level 1 Trauma Center that provides tertiary care, Brother DeBassio's duties include performing chest compressions on coding patients, phlebotomy, cardiac monitoring, and obtaining vitals of patients. The pandemic certainly kept him and colleagues on their toes as they, too, adjusted to the additional personal protective equipment and ever-changing protocols and procedures. Yet, despite the long, grueling days, he is grateful for the opportunity to help patients in their greatest time of need.

Dr. Robert Dourron, Eta 1992 University of Georgia Physician, Atlanta, Georgia

In the midst of a global pandemic, women are still going into labor and babies are still being born. There to assist and help to ensure the health and safety of all involved is Brother Dourron, a board certified obstetrician and gynecologist. Even though a number of his patients have tested positive for COVID-19, Brother Dourron has continued his duties and responsibilities without fail. Selflessly putting himself at risk through constant exposure, Brother Dourron has worked throughout the pandemic adapting to the everchanging policies and procedures.







Dr. Josh Geltman, Beta 2008 Massachusetts Institute of Technology Physician, New York

Few people have a better understanding of the true impact of COVID-19 than Brother Geltman. Working in the emergency room and intensive care unit at a hospital that has found itself in the epicenter of the pandemic, Brother Geltman has tended to hundreds of patients that have tested positive for the virus. The most physically and emotionally demanding aspect of his job is not the multiple layers of personal protective equipment that he has to wear for 12- to 14-hour shifts. but the interaction with families of patients who ultimately succumb to the virus. Goodbyes for these individuals are conducted via video calls - an experience that no family should ever have to endure.

Anthony Peddle, EdD, Alpha-Chi 2014 Ohio Wesleyan University Educator, Columbus, Ohio

There is no doubt that the world of education has been drastically impacted by the pandemic. From virtual learning, to teaching both in person and online simultaneously, to understanding multiple educational platforms, to simply trying to secure resources for students, educators have been taxed in unimaginable ways. And, recognizing all these challenges and desperately seeking a solution, Brother Peddle has worked relentlessly within his school district to ensure resources were obtainable for all students. Brother Peddle is the recent recipient of a \$10,000 grant that will be dedicated to supporting student learning.







Brother Warrington with then-Educational Trust Chairman Chris Shuler, Alpha Zeta 1984, at the 146th Chi Phi Congress in Orlando. Brother Warrington was born in 1935 in Upper Darby, Pennsylvania, and was the oldest of four brothers. As the first in his family to attend college, Warrington enrolling at the University of Florida was an impressive milestone. He set another precedent for his family when he joined Greek Life at UF and became a Brother of the Theta Delta Chapter of Chi Phi - a decision Brother Warrington would openly admit played an impactful role in the outcome of his life:

"Chi Phi provided me the motivation I needed to stay in school," said Warrington. "I knew I needed high grades to be initiated, and I wanted to get initiated. If it weren't for Chi Phi, I would not have made it and who knows how different my life would have been."



After graduating with a degree in Business Administration and Accounting in 1958, he joined the national accounting firm of Arthur Andersen & Company. He quickly distinguished himself within the company and moved from manager, to Partner, to head of the Atlanta auditing division, to, ultimately, being named Managing Partner of the company's new Miami office. His tenure with the company concluded with a move to Houston, Texas, where he established an auditing office.

With more than thirty years dedicated to Arthur Andersen & Company, Brother Warrington retired; however, he by no means slowed down. He became the co-founder and Chairman of Sanifill, Inc., an environmental company based in Houston. After a series of mergers, Sanifill evolved to what it is known as today: Waste Management, Inc. Concurrent to his time with Sanifill, he was involved in the success of several other companies: House of Cheatham, Inc. (Atlanta), Houston Plating and Coatings, and Gulf Coast Mechanical.

Despite a thriving career, Brother Warrington never once forgot the life altering impact Chi Phi had on him. Steadfast in his support at both the local and national level, Brother Warrington was elected as an honorary member of the Nu Delta Chapter at Florida State University in 1979 during his tenure as Grand Epsilon of the National Fraternity from 1975-1980. At the 146th Chi Phi Congress in Orlando, Florida, Brother Warrington was bestowed the Walter Leland Cronkite Jr. Chi Phi Congressional Award for distinguishing himself in business and for his tremendous service and support of philanthropic causes and institutions across the United States, including Chi Phi and the University of Florida.

A true Florida Gator through and through, Brother Warrington was named a UF Distinguished Alumnus in 1979 and in 1985 was named an Outstanding Alumnus by the UF Fisher School of Accounting, which he was instrumental in creating. In 1996 he established an

endowment for the UF College of Business, which was renamed the Warrington College of Business Administration. He served on the UF Board of Trustees, as president of both the UF National Alumni Association and the Gator Booster, and in 2003 he was inducted into the UF Athletic Hall of Fame for his support of Gator Athletics.

Most recently in June of 2018, Brother Warrington was declared the first recipient of the Outstanding Philanthropist Award. Presented by the Educational Trust, this award is conferred to an individual or family with a proven record of exceptional generosity who, through direct financial support, has demonstrated outstanding fraternal and charitable responsibility, and whose generosity encourages others to take philanthropic leadership roles within Chi Phi.

Charles D. Wilson, Theta Delta 1966, entered Chapter Eternal on October 20, 2019. Chuck has the distinction of being Chi Phi's first Assistant National Director, reporting to longtime National Director Carl Gladfelter, Alpha-Tau 1933.

He went on to serve for many years in Washington, DC, including as Chief of Staff to Virginia Congressman Caldwell Butler during the impeachment of Richard Nixon. Chuck referred to it as "an interesting time to be in Washington." Following a nearly two-decade career as a Washington lobbyist, he became a Vice President for Public Affairs for two Fortune 500 companies: The Fort Howard Corporation in Green Bay, Wisconsin, and the Fort James Corporation in Deerfield, Illinois.

Chuck never lost touch with Chi Phi or his Brothers after leaving his role at the National Office, which was in fact his first job after graduating from the University of Florida. He served as an enthusiastic member of Grand Council as Grand Gamma in the 1980s and as President of the National Capitol Chi Phi Club for a number of years. In 1967, Brothers from Theta Delta created the Charles D. Wilson Award to recognize the "Overall Outstanding Student Leader" of the Chapter each year.

In 2015, Chuck, along with his wife Carolyn and daughter Suzanne Wilson Greene, endowed a scholarship for Brothers of the Theta Delta Chapter through the Chi Phi Educational Trust. In his memory and in his honor, the Wilson family has continued to add to that endowment since Chuck's passing.
