CHI PHI CELEBRATES ITS SCHOLARS

The Chi Phi Educational Trust grants over \$100,000 annually in academic and leadership scholarships.

These scholarships are made possible through generous donations from Alumni, Undergraduates, parents, and friends. These gifts allow hundreds of Brothers to continue their pursuit of higher education and develop key leadership skills each year.

The Trust acknowledged thirty-nine exceptional young men with scholarships in 2017. Scholarship award amounts ranged from \$1,000 to \$2,700. With so many impressive young men to be considered, it was a difficult assignment for the Scholarship Review Committee to determine this year's recipients. 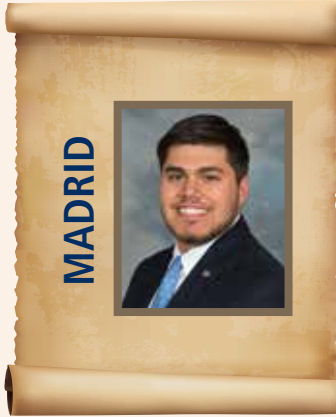

CONGRESS IN ACTION

BROTHERS FROM ACROSS THE COUNTRY AND FROM EVERY GENERATION GATHERED TO DETERMINE THE FUTURE OF OUR FRATERNITY. The new Grand Council, led by Grand Alpha Robert K. Walker, Iota Delta 1970, was sworn in, and legislation was passed altering the Accreditation process, further establishing the standardized New Member Education Plan, and proposing sites for the 153rd Congress in 2018.

The 152nd Congress also unanimously voted to establish the George M. MacDonald Outstanding Risk Manager Award. Brother MacDonald, Kappa Delta 1971, Iota Zeta 1989, Eta Theta 2011, served as Grand Eta from 1997-2005 and again from 2009 to 2017 while also providing legal counsel to the Educational Trust from 1997 to 2017. 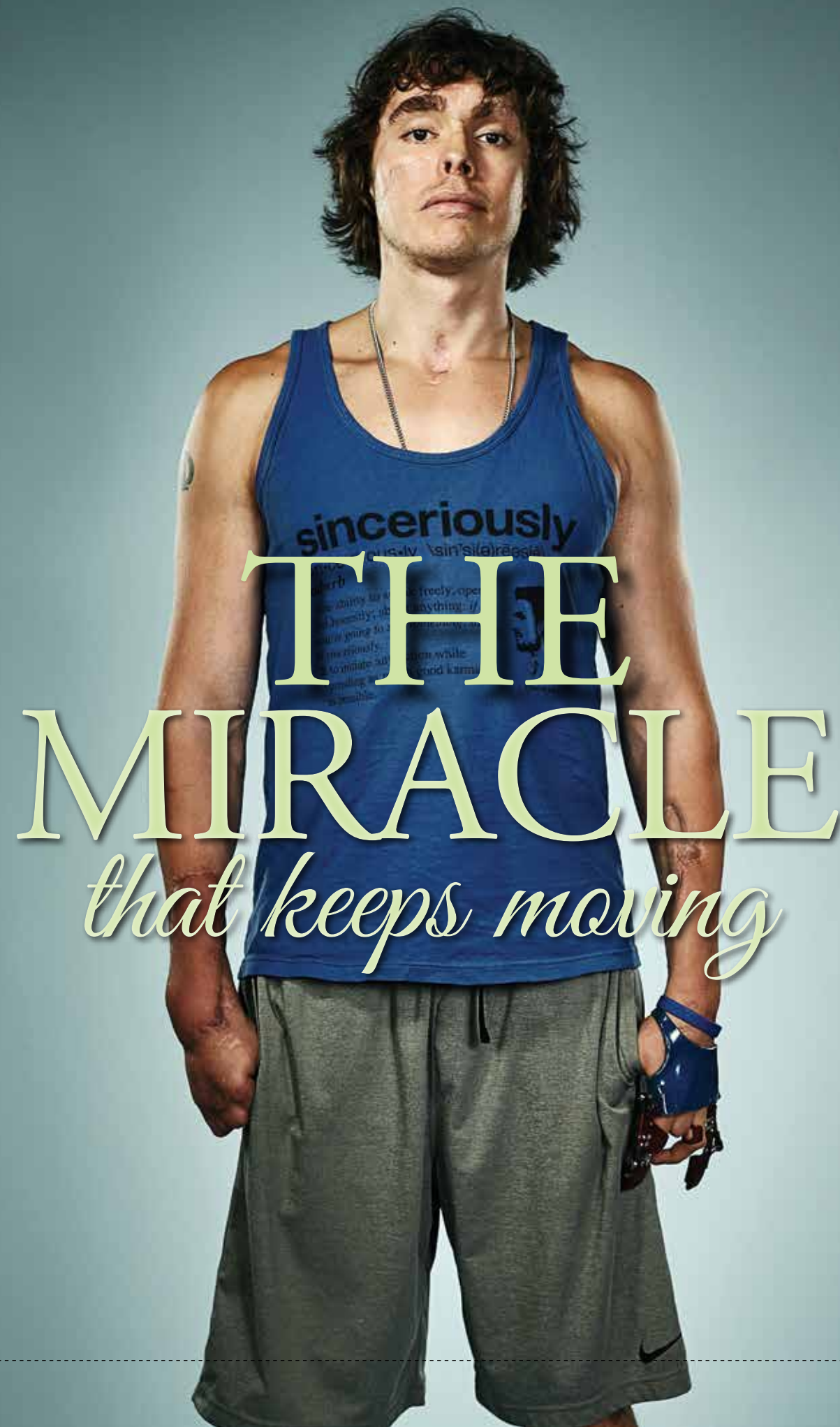

The summer of 2012 found Andrew Oberle, Lambda Zeta 2008, conducting research for his master's degree in anthropology at the Jane Goodall Institute South Africa – a chimpanzee sanctuary outside Johannesburg commonly referred to as Chimp Eden.

"I was supposed to just be in Africa for a few months doing my master's research in a field school, but it ended up being a lot longer." Andrew recalls how his Chapter Brother and roommate of nearly five years, **Anthony Reimherr, Lambda Zeta 2007**, and his wife Marissa had agreed to care for his dog Angie while he was abroad. On this, Andrew's second trip to the sanctuary, he worked closely with the animals he planned to devote his life to, studying their eating habits and behaviors. Andrew began working with animals in high school when he volunteered at the Saint Louis Zoo. He was especially passionate about chimpanzees.

His passion became a tragedy on June 28, 2012, when two adult male chimpanzees escaped their enclosure and attacked. After a long struggle to safely reach Andrew, rescuers transported him to a local clinic before sending him to intensive care in Johannesburg, where, due to the severity of his injuries, he remained in an induced coma for three weeks. Among his other injuries, Andrew was missing most of his fingers, his nose, ears, a piece of his skull, half his right foot and all the toes on his left. In his first surgery alone, he received twenty-two units of blood. After much international press coverage and grassroots support from his family, friends, and Fraternity Brothers, staff and administrators at Saint Louis University Hospital in St. Louis, Missouri – Andrew's hometown – heard his story and arranged to transport Andrew back to the US to continue his treatment.

"While I was in the hospital I was regularly going through

skin graft surgeries throughout those ten weeks of being in-patient. Once I got out of the hospital, for the first year I was going through a pretty regular surgery schedule," he recalled, one of the many procedures even calling for his nose to be reconstructed from skin on his forehead and cartilage from his ribs. But medical treatment was not the only contributing factor in Andrew's recovery; "Once I got out of the hospital and was back home at my mom's house, [Anthony and Marissa] packed up my car, which was still in San Antonio, with a bunch of my stuff and my dog, Angie," and drove to St. Louis to reunite the two. This was just one of many selfless actions taken by the Reimherr family during Andrew's recovery – a party that they had planned for just after the incident to celebrate Anthony's passing the CPA exam and Marissa graduating with her master's degree quickly turned into the first of many fundraisers to help pay for Andrew's care.

Andrew's medical bills mounted quickly. Uninsured, he had to depend on the charity of Saint Louis University Hospital and the generosity of his friends to cover the cost of his care. There was no hesitation. Thousands of dollars were raised by family, friends, and Fraternity Brothers in one night during a fundraiser and raffle event. One Fraternity Brother coined the term "Operation Oberle," and soon rubber bracelets were printed and sold for \$5. Initial donations went toward transporting Andrew's parents to South Africa and then, later on, toward his continued medical expenses. Support came in from all corners of Chi Phi and the globe, including San Antonio businessman Red McCombs, a noted philanthropist who not only donated a substantial amount but was instrumental in arranging for a tax exemption for all donations. Through the combined efforts of his team of medical experts (both on and off the clock), his family and friends, Chi Phi Brothers, and new friends like Mr. McCombs, Andrew excelled in his recovery.

Today, Brother Oberle is able to walk and even run with the help of a prosthesis on his right leg, and he received a bionic hand in 2016. "My activity level got really great," Andrew said, speaking of his continued recovery in the past year, "I was up running 5ks and working out at the gym and Bootcamp [Workout] every morning with a really awesome trainer. It actually got to the point where I was being so active that I broke some of the tissue on my foot down," which necessitated yet another surgery to make his leg more accommodating to his prosthesis. His recovery has exceeded all expectations of his medical team and has inspired a new passion in Andrew; to help other people with traumatic injuries rebuild body, mind, and spirit.

Working toward this goal necessitated a change in Andrew's academic focus. Although his master's thesis was put on hold because of his injuries, Andrew finished that degree after most of his surgeries had been completed. He then began studying Nutrition and Dietetics but was inspired to follow another path; he is now pursuing his master's degree in Health Administration at Saint Louis University – at the same hospital that has treated him since 2012. This shift in focus complemented the work he had already begun on establishing a special unit to help recovering trauma victims like himself. Originally called the Center for Innovative Reconstruction and Rehabilitation, it has recently taken on another name: "After several meetings with our benefactors, including Mr. McCombs and my doctor Bruce Kraemer, who is very invested in this program, we're calling it now the Oberle Institute to really focus on the story and what the hospital did for me and what the hospital can do for other people." The forward momentum that Andrew has taken from his experience inspired Mr. McCombs to dub him "the miracle that keeps moving," a phrase that Andrew has taken to heart.

The Oberle Institute's purpose is to take trauma patients "from the ER to thriving," and stick with them throughout their

entire course of care; something which is often not the standard. The Institute's pilot program rolled out in July 2017 and has accepted its first patient. They eagerly await more patients who meet the study's criteria, although, as Andrew says, "it would be awesome if we didn't need what we need; if nobody got hurt." In order to prove the Oberle Institute's value and implement it permanently, it must show that particular outcomes improve when trauma patients receive this care, giving them a better recovery and "achieving an optimal level of healing," a process with which Andrew is intimately familiar. "[The trauma] really shatters your worldview on your own identity. I'm not working with animals anymore," he says, "It really takes a toll on you. The trauma is one thing, but the psychological part of it, what's happening to your life, that's a big part." Andrew hopes to inspire trauma patients with his story. "Up to this point I've only met a few patients that have had injuries similar to mine, but I've met them all in an outpatient setting, well after their injuries occurred. The response I've gotten from [our first] patient has been nothing but positive. He tells me coming in cheers him up, provides that inspiration that helps him not think about the bad things [he's] going through in the moment but focus on the recovery. I look back, and that would have been great to meet somebody like me when I was in the hospital." Andrew has also begun planning the "big picture stuff," meeting with contractors to discuss a permanent facility for the Oberle Institute, equipped with inpatient and outpatient clinic care and a base for interprofessional research and education to train care providers and researchers, all for the betterment of the patient – in this case, the trauma patient.

The forward momentum that Andrew has taken from his experience inspired Mr. McCombs to dub him "the miracle that keeps moving," a phrase that Andrew has taken to heart.

This is not to say that Brother Oberle's love for chimpanzees or other animals has diminished. Recalling the often tedious hours of schoolwork he has put in during graduate school, "There's sometimes when I'm sitting there working on a literature review for a couple weeks where I think, 'Man, I could really go for shoveling some animal poop right now in 100 degree weather.' I still miss it sometimes but this is my new life purpose and I want to make sure that I can help as many people as I can with it." His new academic ambitions have paid off though, as SLU

is covering most of the cost of his degree. But for Andrew, "it's not about the money, it's not about the institution's prestige, it's about what this place did for me and I want to give back to it and I think this place gives other patients the absolute best chance for having an amazing recovery." Andrew recalls, "what really changed my path was getting that call...from the University saying 'you have an incredible story and if SLU can do this for you why can't they do it for everyone else?'" That conversation and the beginning of the Oberle Institute "really started to answer the 'why me' question that had been in my head for the previous couple years...it really helped me realize there was a higher purpose for what happened to me, and this was it, and it would be irresponsible of me not to follow in this purpose. Before this I was working in zoos and sanctuaries to do everything I could to make animals' lives better. I especially loved working in the sanctuary where there were rescued animals who had actually suffered through some trauma so really I have the same purpose, I've only just kind of switched species."

Brother Oberle has also taken time during his recovery to give back to another group which has supported him: his Brothers at the Lambda Zeta Chapter. Andrew's first encounter with Chi Phi was in the fall of 2004 when Brothers helped him and his parents move into a dorm at St. Mary's. He says that at the beginning of his first semester on campus, "they felt like family to me from the get-go." Four years of Brotherhood as an Undergraduate left many invisible impressions on Andrew, but he did leave campus with one visible mark: A tattoo of Chi Phi letters. In addition to being an ever-present reminder of the memories that Andrew created with his Chi Phi Brothers, the tattoo served as a visible marker in another capacity; when his mother finally arrived at his bedside in South Africa: "She just didn't believe it was me. I was bandaged from head to toe...tubes coming out of every part of me and all these machines hooked up to me...she said the only reason she knew that it was me and that they weren't lying was because of the Chi Phi tattoo on my right shoulder."

His tattoo, however, has not been the limit of the connection that Andrew has had with Chi Phi in recent years. Though he now lives in St. Louis year-round, Brother Oberle frequently reconnects with his Chapter at St. Mary's throughout the year. San Antonio's biggest event of the year, Fiesta Week, finds the campus overrun with visitors from around the country, including Andrew and other Lambda Zeta Alumni who use the occasion to establish new bonds with the Undergraduates and each other. Just last year, Andrew gave the Undergraduates a run for their money during an Alumni vs. Undergraduates softball game.

Andrew recently added another element to his "new life purpose" that he spoke of. He and his fiancée had a baby girl, Lily, in July. "We just finished putting the finishing touches on the nursery," Andrew excitedly told us. With his development of the Oberle Institute, the arrival of his first child, and his continued involvement with the Lambda Zeta Chapter, Andrew will certainly have many moving miracles to look forward to in the coming years. **"[I try to] always be grateful for everything. I sometimes say, 'don't think of it as glass half empty, glass half full kind of thing, just be grateful that you have a glass, and go from there.'"**

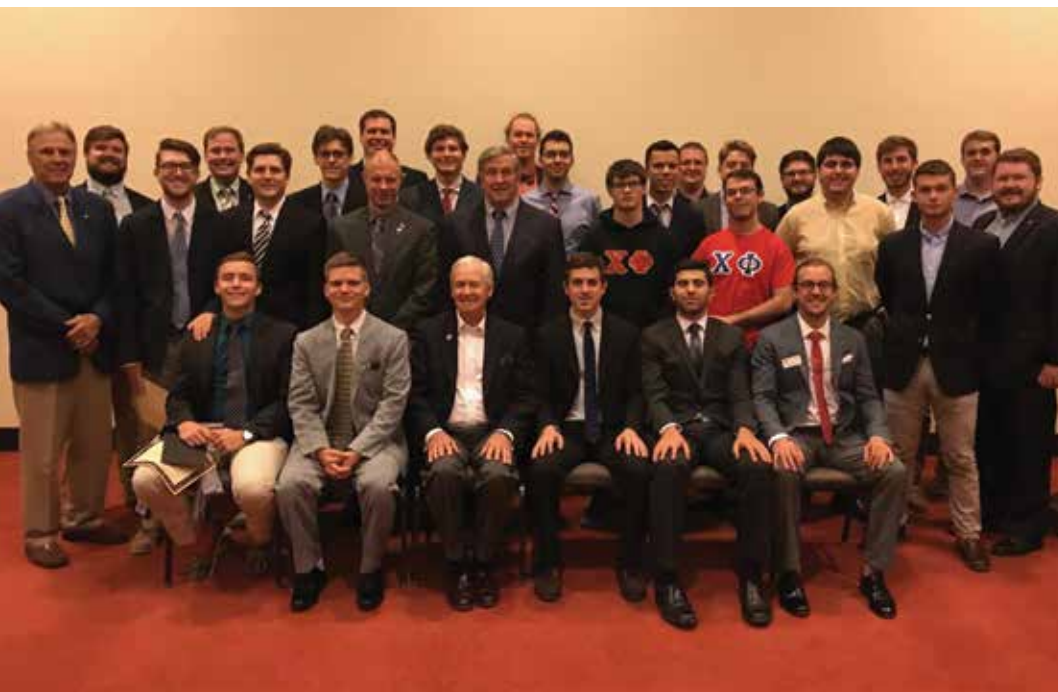
Tau Chapter at University of Alabama

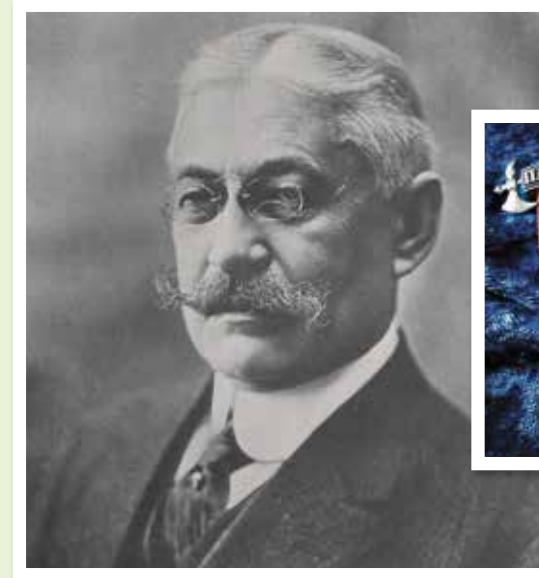

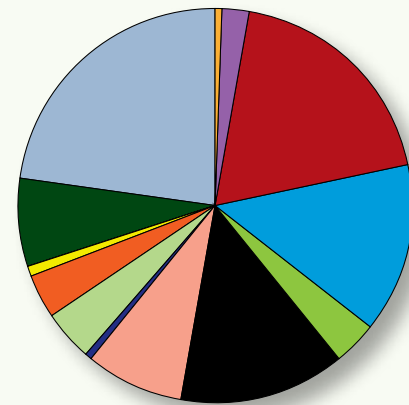


THE 2016 – 2017 ANNUAL REPORT of the CHI PHI EDUCATIONAL TRUST

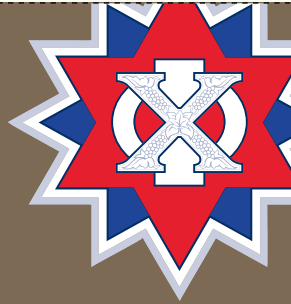

REMEMBERING CHI PHI

As the only First Lieutenant on our team, I'll certainly be ready for my promotion to Captain in the coming months."

He has found it difficult at times to stay connected to his loved ones in the US, but he says that he is "truly grateful for my supportive parents, family and friends. Most importantly, my fiancée, Margaret, has amazed me with her strength and grace through all of this. She often gets what is left of me after stressful days from over 7,000 miles and 8 time zones away. I'm so lucky to have her, and am looking forward to calling her Mrs. Keyes when I get back home."

Said Trust is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and contributions to it are deductible under the provisions of federal income, gift and estate tax laws.

Individuals who have made the Chi Phi Educational Trust or their Chapter a beneficiary of their Last Will and Testament are asked to provide an attorney's letter or copy of this page from their Will so Chi Phi can acknowledge the donor's generosity and properly plan its future.

Alternative ways to remember Chi Phi after your death are naming the Chi Phi Educational Trust as a beneficiary of your retirement plan or life insurance policy. Individuals can also set up a Charitable Gift Annuity or Charitable Remainder Trust.

WORLD WAR II VETERANS

In this edition of The Chakett, we have the bittersweet honor of recognizing fifteen of our dear Brothers from the Greatest Generation who have entered Chapter Eternal. All fifteen of these True Gentlemen served their country in World War II before becoming pillars in their communities through business, philanthropy, and leadership. While Chi Phi mourns their loss, we also rejoice in the time that we called them Brothers.

Lacy Hyman Arnold, Gamma 1948, passed November 29, 2016. He joined the Army Air Corps and flew resupply missions in the Himalayas. Brother Arnold went on to serve in the Korean War and the Vietnam War before retiring at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.

Dr. Fred M. Bell Jr., Gamma 1948, passed March 2, 2017. He served in the Merchant Marine during the end of World War II and later continued his service as a surgeon with the United States Air Force.

C. Allen Davis, Alpha Delta 1942, passed January 17, 2017. He earned a degree in mechanical engineering before enlisting in the United States Navy and serving in the Pacific Theatre.

Dr. Fred T. Edmunds, Epsilon 1941, passed December 28, 1997. He served in the United States Army.

William Fisher Jr., Xi 1940, passed March 4, 2017. He was drafted after Pearl Harbor and taught gunnery in Oklahoma before being transferred to the Philippines at the end of the war. He also served in the Korean War.
